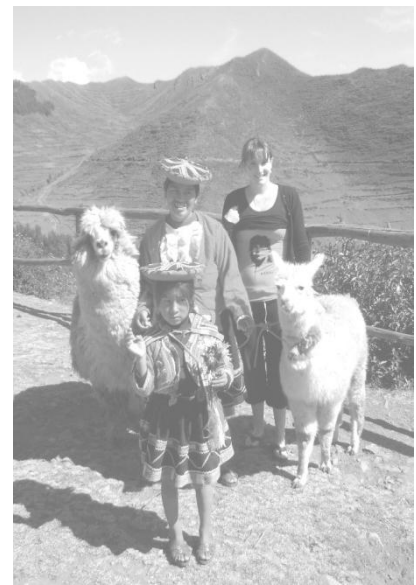
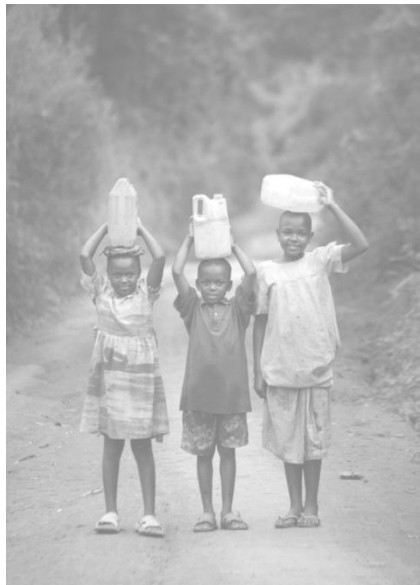




Eat So They Can 2009 Funds Distribution



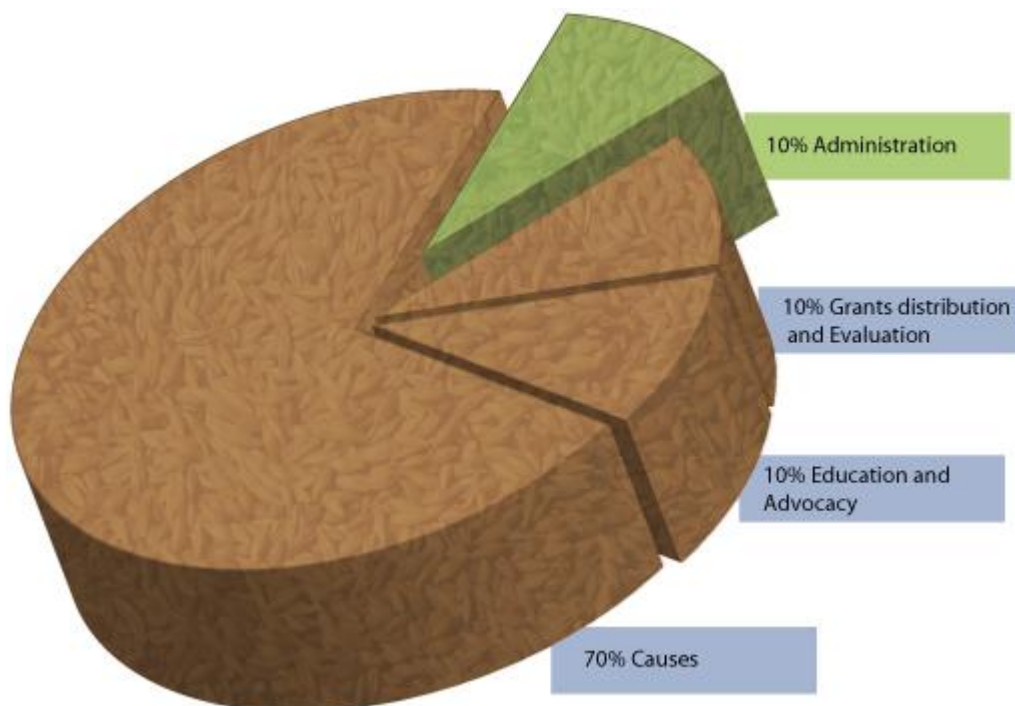

2009 Funds Distribution

Eat So They Can raised \$193,000 in 2009. These funds have been distributed to GVN Foundation's partner organizations in Africa and Latin America, improving the lives of more than 3,200 children.

Grants

As illustrated by the pie-chart above, a minimum of 70% of the funds raised through ESTC 2009 were directly granted out to our partner organizations. We support our partners both with immediate needs grants, as well as sustainability grants. Thank you to all of our hosts and participants for making the following grants possible!

> Ethiopia

In Ethiopia, we provided a grant to support children at Mercy Ministry Happy Children's Home with medical care, clothing, education and training. Children served: 18.





> Kenya

In Kenya, we supported a number of orphanages, schools and camps as follows:

Shelter Children's Home – Electricity and income-generating projects (farming and crafts). Children served: 198.

Cheryls Children's Home – Food, electricity and income-generating projects (jewellery). Children served: 185.

El Shaddai – Income-generating projects (farming). Children served: 167.

Happy Life – Baby formula and medical support. Children served: 42.

Pipeline and Kikopey IDP camps – Porridge program. Children served: 650.

Pipeline IDP camp – House construction. Families served: 7.

Silaom School and Orphanage – Exam fees. Children served: 9.

Olo Oshobar School – Desks and chairs. Children served: 20.

Ingarooj School – Food, water and classroom renovation. Children served: 390.

Aberdare Ranges School – Classroom construction. Children served: 360.

> Peru

In Peru, we helped fund scholarships for the Peruvian Promise Program. This program aims to provide 16 girls with access to the best educational opportunities so that they are able to step out of poverty. Children served: 16

> South Africa

In South Africa, we funded food, activity supplies, transport, and staff salaries for the ZOTE winter school. Children served: 250.

> Tanzania

In Tanzania, we helped fund the lunch program at Losinoni Primary School, which has improved school attendance and reduced malnutrition. Children served: 750.

> Uganda

In Uganda, we helped fund teacher salaries, stationery, printing and firewood costs at Springs of Hope High School. Children served: 76.

In addition, we helped fund the construction of a teacher and volunteer house at Passionate Children and Elderly Care Center (PACE). Children served: 80.
