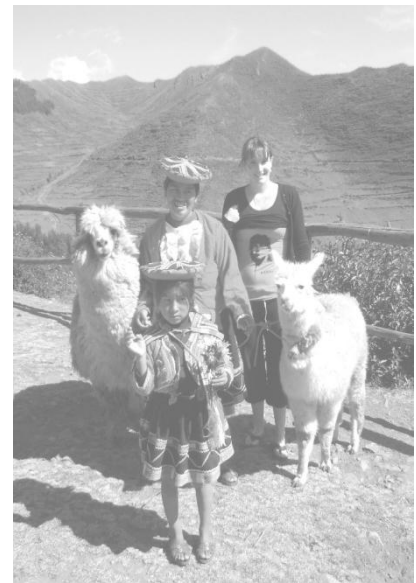
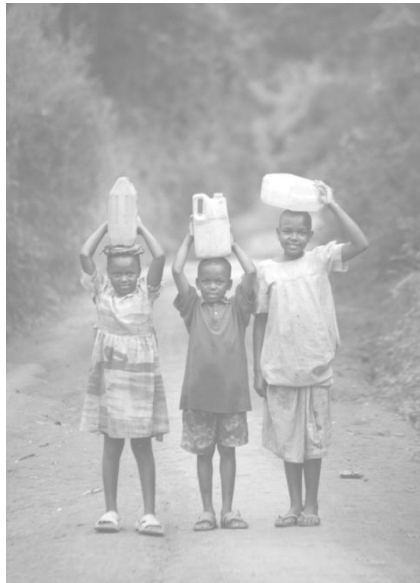




Eat So They Can 2010 Funds Distribution



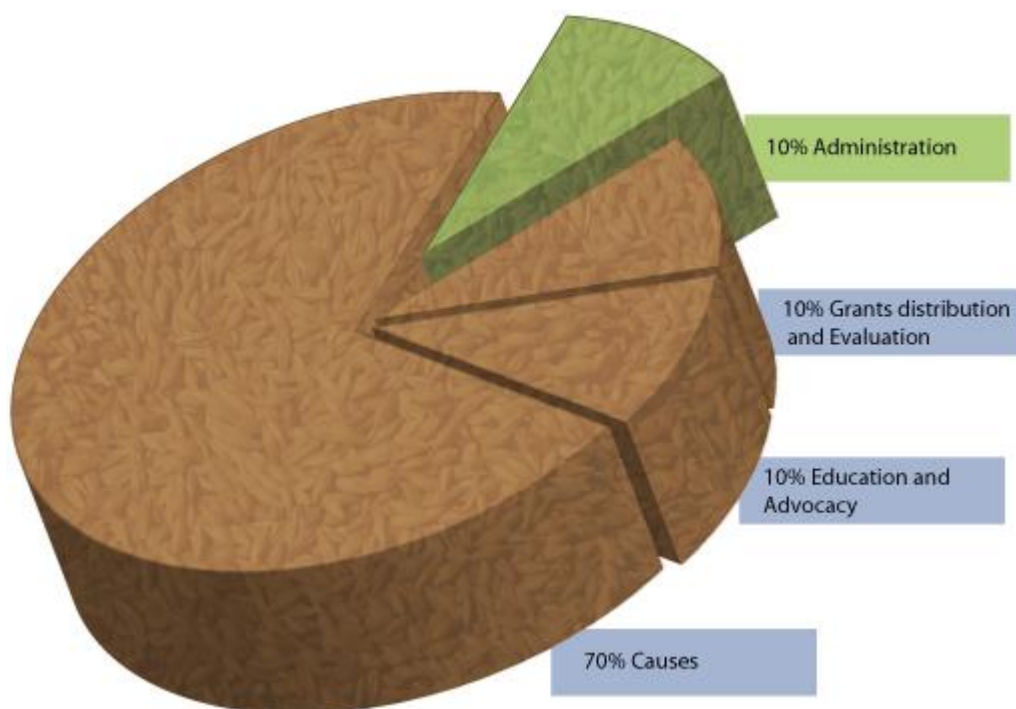

2010 Funds Distribution

Eat So They Can raised \$179,000 in 2010. These funds are being distributed to GVN Foundation's projects in Africa, Asia and Latin America.

Funds Breakdown



Grants

As illustrated by the pie-chart above, a minimum of 70% of the funds raised through ESTC 2010 are being directly granted out to our partner organizations. We support our partners both with immediate needs grants, as well as sustainability grants. Below is a summary of the grants that have been distributed to date. Thank you to all of our hosts and supporters for making these grants possible!





AFRICA

> Ethiopia

In Ethiopia we are supporting Mercy Ministry Happy Children's Home Association. Eat So They Can funding has been used to identify and screen 18 children to join MMHCH; to provide educational support to 71 reunified street children; to provide business training and start up capital for 30 underprivileged families; and to organize three reunion events for the children.

> Kenya

In Kenya we have purchased five water tanks for Aberdare Ranges School. We have also provided assistance to Internally Displaced People through grants for education, nutrition and housing. In addition, we have provided grants for food, medical and hygiene supplies at several orphanages and schools in and around Nairobi.

> Rwanda

In Rwanda, we have provided an ESTC grant to support a chicken project at Mpore Pefa Orphanage. The funds have been used to purchase chicken feed and 25 new chickens, as well as expand the chicken house.

> Tanzania

In Tanzania, we helped fund the lunch program at Losinoni Primary School for 750 children, which improves school attendance and reduces malnutrition.

> Uganda

In Uganda, we have funded a goat project at Johnson Nkosi Memorial School, and a piggery at an orphanage and education centre in the Mukoko District. We have also provided a grant to fund teacher salaries at Springs of Hope High School.

In addition, we have used funding from our women's empowerment cause to support a micro-credit and cow project at YOFAFO, which is providing women and their families with new sources of income.

LATIN AMERICA

> Costa Rica

In Costa Rica, we have supported a soup kitchen in La Carpio shanty town in San Jose.

> Peru

In Peru, we have helped to fund the first year of the Peruvian Promise Program which is providing scholarships, school uniforms, textbooks, school supplies and experiential retreats for 16 girls. We have also funded a breakfast program at Lamay school for 360 students for one year. In addition, we have funded a jewellery workshop at a community center in Cusco to empower women and give them a new source of income for their families.



ASIA

> **India**

In India, we have funded the construction of six toilets and we have purchased a cow at Shimshon Dowley Children Welfare and Charitable Trust. In addition, we have supported an orphanage with food and clothing for the children.

> **Nepal**

In Nepal, we have assisted in funding the operating costs of residential centres run by Antardristi for vulnerable children in Kathmandu, Pokhara, and Hetauda.

> **Philippines**

In the Philippines, we have provided a grant to purchase furniture and paint for a new library in San Agustin, Romblon.

> **Thailand**

In Thailand, we have funded the hiring of a vocational trainer at Sunshine House. The trainer will teach three classes in sewing, hairdressing and card-making to help empower and enable the girls at this project.

> **Vietnam**

In Vietnam we have assisted schools and orphanages in Tuy Hoa, Da Nang and Tam Ky with food and hygiene supplies.
